Message from the Executive Officer

Where do I start? I realize there are literally thousands if not millions of people sharing a similar sentiment right now in an attempt to describe the impact from events that have transpired in the world since the Board's last *Bulletin* was published in early January 2020. Simply put, the Board has tried to maintain some

semblance of normal operations throughout these events. While the office has been closed to public access for safety and to comply with social distancing requirements, applications are still being received, accepted, and reviewed; licenses are still being issued where allowable; and complaints are still being received and investigated. I would like to thank the Board's staff, and those at Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) who have assisted the Board with ensuring our operational responsibilities are being met throughout the unprecedented last several months. There were many bumps and hurdles toward establishing effective teleworking and shift arrangements, some of which are still being fine-tuned along the way, but for the most part, operations continued thanks to the efforts by those individuals.

One of the areas that affected licensing applicants the most was related to the cancellation of all national and state licensing examinations. The Board maintained constant communication with national and contract examination vendors in an effort to adjust as conditions changed, even when those changes occurred on a daily and even hourly basis. By the time this issue of the *Bulletin* is published, appointments for state exams are happening again, albeit in compliance with continued social distancing measures and less than optimal capacity at testing centers; but nonetheless, examinations are being administered again. On the national scene, both NCEES and ASBOG are finalizing arrangements during the fall 2020 paper/pencil-based administrations to accommodate all the candidates whose examinations were canceled in the spring. As someone who also had to apply in the past and has sat for licensing examinations, I can certainly understand the confusion and dismay being felt by applicants being prohibited from sitting for the necessary examinations and obtaining a license. I would also like to recognize the tremendous patience and fortitude applicants have shown with the Board and staff during this crisis. We are doing everything we can to make sure you have the opportunities to complete your licensing process.

On an even more somber note, the Board suddenly and tragically lost one of its own during this time. Robert Stockton, PE, civil engineer Board member since July 2012, passed away in May. All of us at the Board are truly very sad to lose Bob. If I may speak for others at the Board, he will be missed for quite some time.

The Board's plan is to move forward together in an effort to recognize Bob's desire for continuing to pursue improved operations at the Board by establishing a better application/licensing process; by maintaining appropriate fiscal responsibilities; by continuing to ensure that California applicants and licensees are represented on the national level with NCEES and ASBOG, and by continuing to ensure that disciplinary actions by the Board are handled in the most appropriate manner possible.

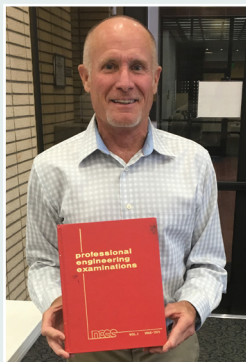
Board News

Some past Board members will be remembered for how active they were while serving the Board while others simply assume the responsibility on a quieter yet efficient level.

Robert Alan Stockton, Professional Civil Engineer license 33591, will be remembered for both of those examples along with many others. Bob, as we all knew him (simply Bob—a last name wasn't necessary), suddenly and tragically passed away May 13, 2020. Bob was originally appointed as the civil engineer Board member by Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. in July 2012 and reappointed by Governor Brown in July 2015, serving as Board president for 2015-16. Additionally, Bob represented the California Board nationally at NCEES by serving on the Committee on Finances for several years. Bob always had the time to help those at the Board by assisting with monitoring long-range planning for budgets and providing his advice at strategic opportunities.

All of us at the Board were, and still are, in shock and sad at this unfortunate event. In many ways, Bob very successfully represented many of us simultaneously during his tenure on the Board—civil engineer; businessman; family man; community leader; colleague; confidant; adviser; friend; and Board member.

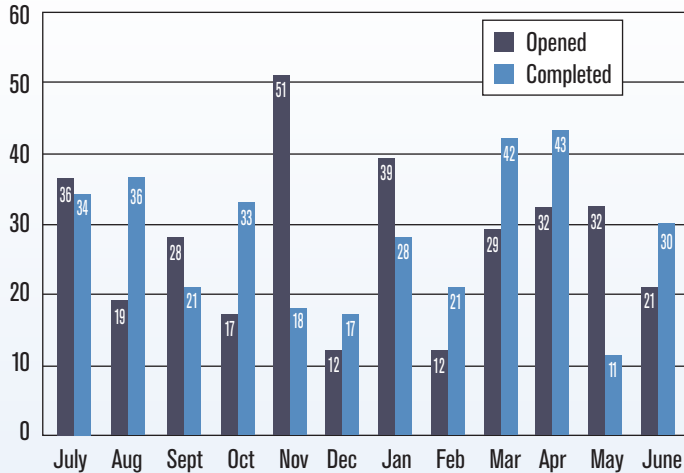

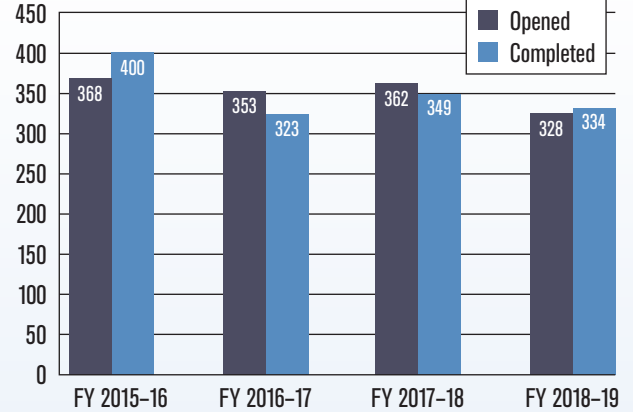
ENFORCEMENT UNIT REPORTS AND INFORMATION

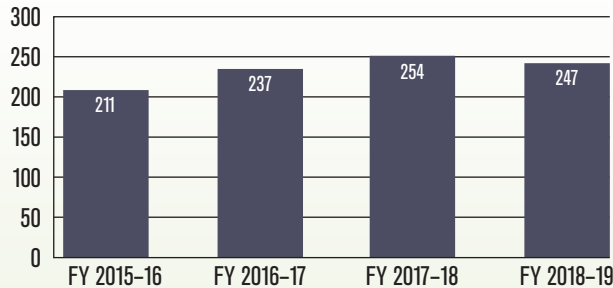
NUMBER OF COMPLAINT INVESTIGATIONS OPENED AND COMPLETED BY MONTH (fiscal year 2018-19)



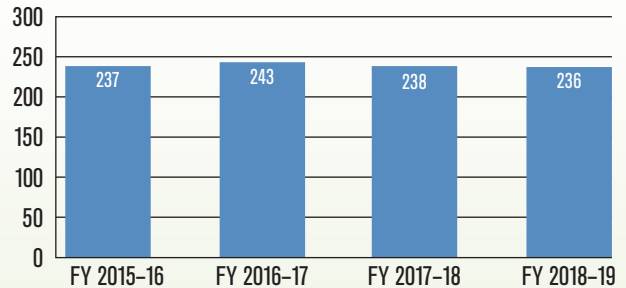
COMPLAINT INVESTIGATIONS OPENED AND COMPLETED



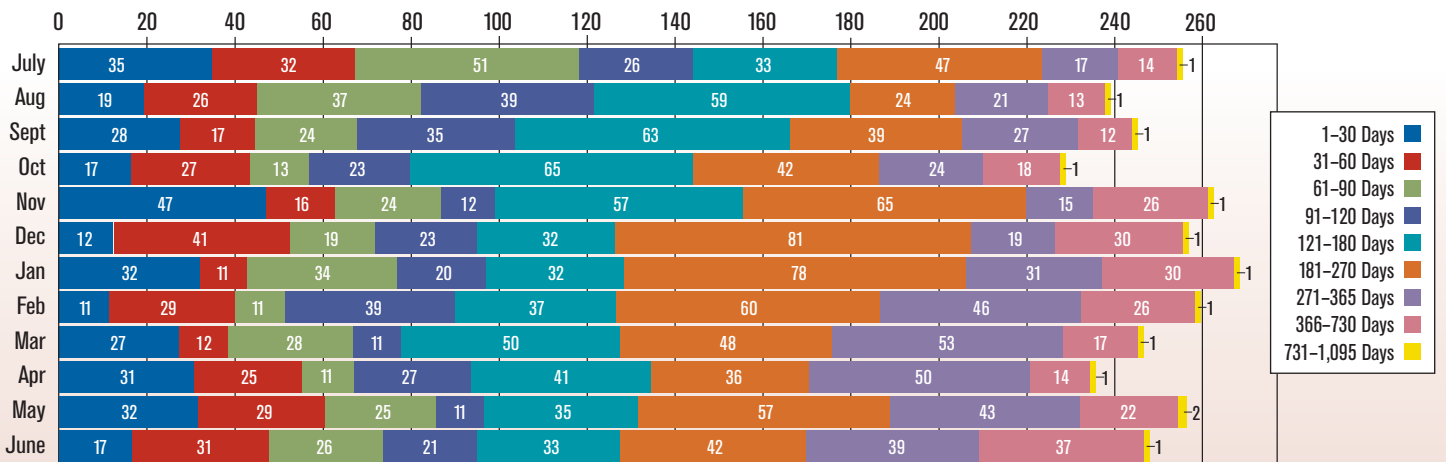
NUMBER OF OPEN (PENDING) COMPLAINT INVESTIGATIONS

AGING OF OPEN (PENDING) COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION CASES (fiscal year 2018-19)



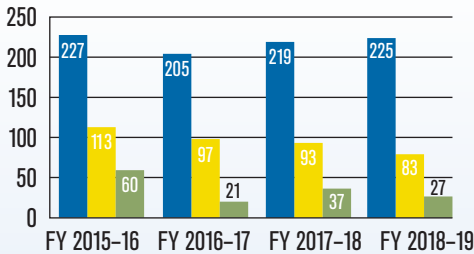

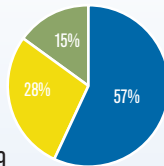

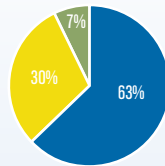

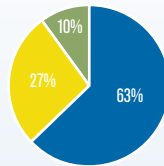

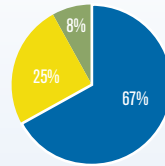

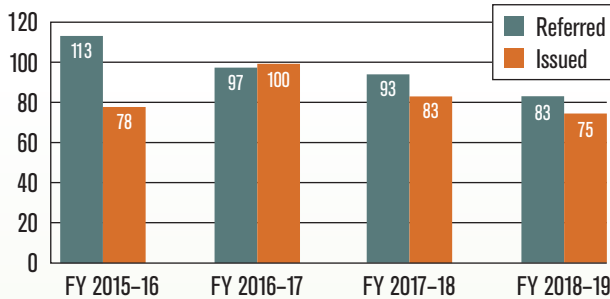

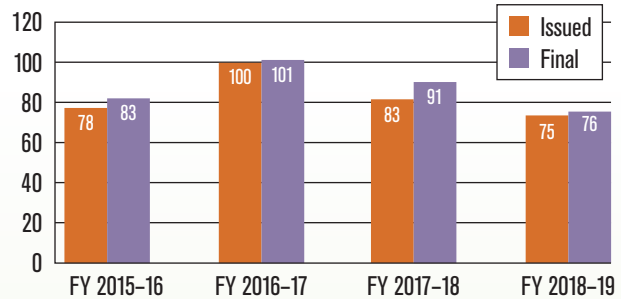

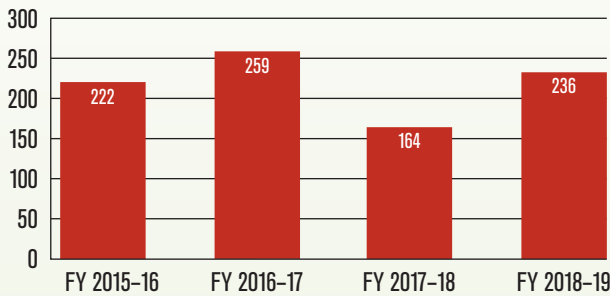
NUMBER OF COMPLAINT INVESTIGATIONS REFERRED AND NUMBER OF CITATIONS ISSUED



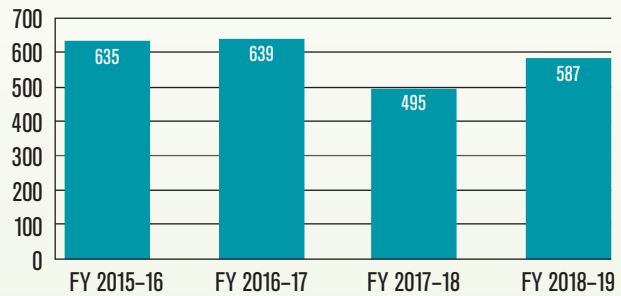
NUMBER OF CITATIONS ISSUED AND FINAL



AVERAGE DAYS BETWEEN DATE OF ISSUANCE OF CITATION AND DATE CITATION BECOMES FINAL

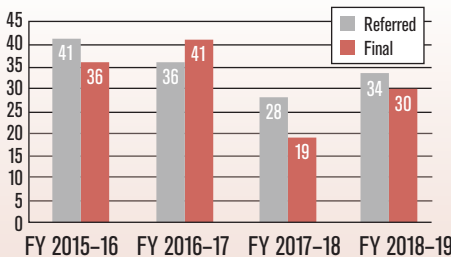


AVERAGE DAYS FROM OPENING OF COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION TO DATE CITATION BECOMES FINAL

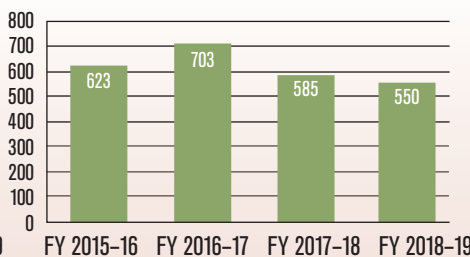


FORMAL DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS AGAINST LICENSEES

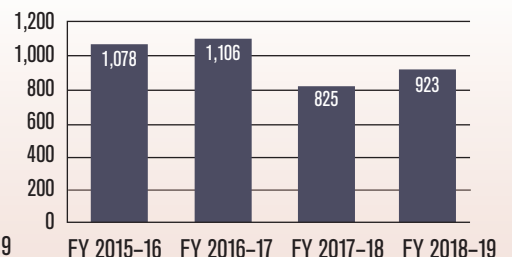

Legislation and Regulation News and Updates

Every legislative session the Board tracks, analyzes, and if necessary, sponsors bills that potentially impact the Board's operations, the licensed professions the Board regulates, and the statutes that determine that authority. We consistently strive to identify, analyze, and advertise at public Board meetings the bills introduced that may change the landscape of our statutory authority. Currently, the Board has no sponsored bills for this legislative session. Regulatory Proposal on Fee Changes

The Board proposes to amend sections 407, 410, and 3005 and to adopt section 3010 of Divisions 5 and 29 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations. This proposal is designed to enable the board to maintain its licensing, disciplinary, and oversight operations to protect California's consumers, while also ensuring any projected surpluses are within appropriate fund reserve limits. Additionally, the fee structure proposed will set effective policy decisions that foster an affordable path to licensure, align fees with the full cost of operational services, set fees to facilitate the effective administration of the board, and respond more efficiently to the needs of the public, applicants, and licensees. Get to Know Our Licensees

Kristy Riley, P.E., PMP, P.M./Hydraulic Engineer, Hydrologic Engineering Center, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers



Why did you become an engineer?

I always enjoyed science, math and problem solving. Going into engineering seemed to provide a career that would be challenging and fulfilling.

What attracted you to your field, and what positions have you held as you advanced your career?

My career thus far has been with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. I was attracted to water resources and the Corps has provided a wide range of opportunities to broaden my experience. I started my career in hydraulics, using computer models to simulate channel hydraulics and floodplain inundation. I then transitioned to water management, where I regulated reservoirs in the Western Cascades and upper Columbia River Basin. With a comprehensive background in both hydrology (understanding weather patterns for reservoir regulation) and hydraulics, I transitioned to my current position as a project manager for the Corp's Hydrologic Engineering Center (HEC), which is their nationwide center of expertise for hydrology and hydraulic engineering.

Do you have any family members or relatives in your field?

Yes, lots. My dad received degrees in chemical and environmental engineering; my sister is a civil engineer; my grandfather was an aeronautical engineer; and a couple of my uncles and cousins also received engineering degrees. My husband is a civil engineer as well.

Where did you attend school (post high school), and what degrees do you hold?

California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo—Bachelor of Science in civil engineering. University of California, Davis—master's in civil and environmental engineering.

What value does your professional license represent to you, and how has it helped in your career?

My professional engineering license provides baseline credibility but it is much more than that. It was a goal set early on in my career, representing a qualified, responsible, and dedicated professional. Now, it represents a model for me as a professional, which is something to both uphold and respect. I can say that throughout my work, I continue to keep the license as a token of responsibility and something vital to the advancement of the profession. It's a backdrop but one that pushes me to go the extra mile to ensure that I'm doing the right thing, technically and ethically.

What are your responsibilities and duties in your current position?

At HEC, I have many responsibilities: My largest is as project manager for the Corps Water Management System, which is an innovative software package used nationwide by 36 Corps offices. It integrates a multitude of real-time riverine and reservoir data, other software packages, and outputs information to various stakeholders for reservoir decision-making. The program ingests real-time data, contains database storage, runs flow forecasting of watershed runoff, supports reservoir operational decisions, computes river profiles, presents inundated areas, and analyzes

economic and life safety consequences. As the project manager, I coordinate and track various software enhancements and program maintenance efforts to support the Corps' Water Management Community of Practice. I also ensure monthly project performance by measuring budget commitments and schedule milestones, with responsibility to the Corps' HQ office in Washington and the U.S. Office of Management and Budget.

Briefly discuss the biggest challenges you face as an engineer, specifically noting changes in your field that you have seen since graduating from college.

Changes in historical weather patterns and more extreme hydrological conditions make reservoir regulation more challenging. Strong atmospheric rivers, extended periods of drought, and early spring freshets all highlight the need for agile reservoir regulations to better balance so many changing conditions. Dependent on hydrological and physical conditions, reservoir regulations should allow for optimal releases to best balance many different priorities—water supply, flood risk reduction, ecological flows, hydropower, recreation, water quality, etc.

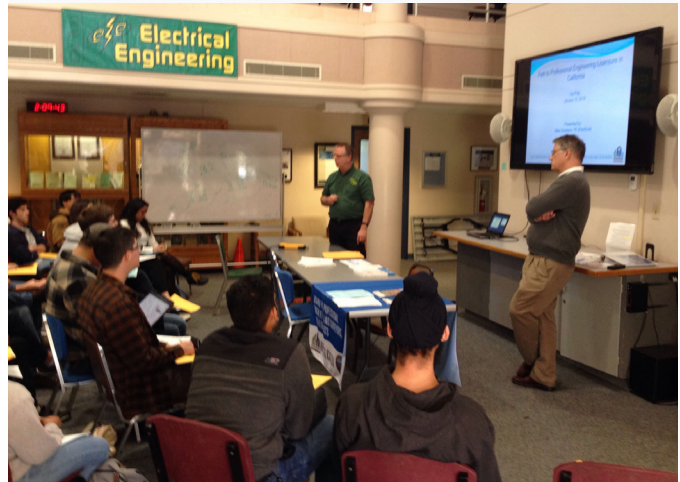

Enforcement Actions

Citations Issued to Unlicensed Individuals: Fiscal Year 2019–20 (January–March)

Citations are an alternative to criminal prosecutions that the Board can use to enforce the laws prohibiting the unlicensed practice of engineering, land surveying, geology, and geophysics, or other activities for which a license is required. When a fine is levied with a citation, payment of the fine does not constitute admission of any violations charged but represents a satisfactory resolution of the matter pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.9(d). Code sections numbered in the 6700s, 7800s, and 8700s refer to the Business and Professions Code; those numbered in the 400s and 3000s refer to Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations. You can look up the code sections and read the laws on the Board’s website, www.bpelsg.ca.gov/laws/index.shtml. All final citations are matters of public record. Citations Issued to Licensees: Fiscal Year 2019–20 (January–March)

Citations are issued to licensed engineers, land surveyors, geologists, and geophysicists when the severity of a violation may not warrant suspension or revocation of the licensee’s right to practice. When a fine is levied with a citation, payment of the fine does not constitute admission of any violations charged but represents a satisfactory resolution of the matter, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.9(d). Code sections numbered in the 6700s, 7800s, and 8700s refer to the Business and Professions Code; those numbered in the 400s and 3000s refer to Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations. You can read the laws on the Board’s website, www.bpelsg.ca.gov/laws/index.shtml. All final citations are matters of public record. Formal Administrative Disciplinary Decisions: Fiscal Year 2019–20 (January–March)

A formal disciplinary decision is considered formal administrative disciplinary action against a licensee. It results from the Board's adoption of a proposed decision prepared by an administrative law judge following a hearing, a stipulated settlement agreement, or a default decision following a full investigation and the filing of an accusation. An accusation is a formal legal document that notifies a licensee of the Board's charges and allegations of violations against the licensee and that requests a disciplinary order be issued. The licensee is entitled to contest the charges at a formal hearing before an administrative law judge or to agree to a stipulated settlement. A final disciplinary decision contains findings and determinations or statements of advisements, waivers, and culpability and a disciplinary order. If there are findings of violations, the order may include revocation or suspension of the license, a stayed revocation or suspension of the license with a probationary period and terms and conditions of probation, or a public reproof. In the alternative, the decision may find that no violations or violations of a de minimus nature occurred and order the dismissal of the accusation. All final disciplinary decisions are matters of public record. October 2020 Exam Administration Updates

As posted to NCEES.org on April 14:

The cancellation of the April 2020 paper-and-pencil examination administration impacted approximately 16,000 examinees. To accommodate these examinees, the format of the October 2020 exam administration will be modified as detailed below.

Exam administration format

Registration for the October 2020 paper-and-pencil exam administration opened at 10 a.m. EDT on June 1 and will close at 3 p.m. EDT on August 20. The exam administration will take place over two days—Thursday, October 22 and Friday, October 23. Please note that exams usually offered once a year during the April administration will be offered in October. Exams will be administered on the day assigned as follows:

All sites for the October 2020 exam administration must operate in compliance with capacity and social distancing requirements. In most cases, this will reduce the number of examinees that can be accommodated at an exam site. Examinees will be allowed to complete the registration process only when a seat is available for their selected site. Capacity and social distancing requirements are subject to change at any time. **Any changes that require a further reduction in capacity may result in the cancellation of your exam registration.** Please be aware that every effort will be made to accommodate all registered examinees in a manner that protects the health and safety of everyone involved.

Appointments are limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. Examinees who need to schedule or reschedule an appointment should do so as soon as possible through their MyNCEES account for the best availability. Only open test centers will appear in your search.
